- ___ 3. Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended

A copy of the university-approved course of study for eligibility for a dietetic internship with any substituted courses indicated

A list of courses in progress or to be taken in the future
- ___ 4. A Declaration of Intent or Verification Statement signed by an ADA Didactic Program Director located at an accredited college or university
- ___ 5. Three recommendations using the ADA Recommendation Form
Two references should be from professors in the major field of study
Original signatures are required on recommendation forms.
- ___ 6. A completed Credentials Disclosure form
